

WHAT IS PHONICS?

Phonics is the understanding that there is a predictable relationship between phonemes (the sounds of spoken language) and graphemes (the letters that represent them in written language).

The ability to use phonetic skills is an essential component of reading and writing.





Words to know

Phoneme

 Smallest unit of sound ('phone') – what you <u>hear</u>

Grapheme

 The letters we use to represent the sounds/phonemes What is a phoneme?

A phoneme is the smallest unit of sound in a word.

Example: /k/

What is a grapheme?

A grapheme is the way we write a phoneme.

/k/ can be written 5 ways c k ck qu ch






Arriving at school from 8:20am Students wait seated in the COLA for a teacher to come on duty to supervise them on the backfield.
