Leaving in 2021?

Staff Development Day (SDD) Changes:

Over the last few years, staff were given two Staff Development Days at the end of Term 4 each year. The Department has now officially moved one of these Staff Development Days to the beginning of Term 1.

Presentation Day

Transition into new classes

Whilst very much focused on the academic work and range of co-curricular programs that are set down for the remainder of 2020, our staff are also planning carefully for the 2021 school year. One of the key areas that we begin to consider at this time of year are the strategies that we put into place to enable our students to have a smooth transition from their class this year to the grade that they will be in for 2021.

Heading into 2021 our enrolment numbers are right on the cusp of 11 or 12 classes. At the beginning of a school year we often return to find that some families have moved away and others have moved into the area over the Summer break. With our numbers being so close we cannot confidently communicate to students or families who the class teachers will be for 2021. We have a strong plan for both 11 or 12 classes, but will need to wait until the start of the school year to determine what our class structures will look like.

Due to the unpredictability of our numbers, it has been decided that the school will be placed in holding pattern for the first two weeks of the school year. This strategy is used in many schools as it minimises long term disruption and removes the need to restructure classes. In the new year, students will return to their 2020 class and wherever possible, their 2020 teacher, to ensure a smooth transition. Once our new Kindergarten students arrive and our numbers are finalised, we will move into our 2021 class structures.

There will be some classes that will not change regardless of whether we have 11 or 12 classes and in some circumstances this information will be shared with families.

A wonderful thing about our school is that we have a high-quality staff, all with their own strengths. Across the years, each teacher will add to the learning experience of your child.

K-2 playground

P&C The were recently successful in \$30,000 Community Building gaining a Partnership This money grant. will contribute towards the installation of our K-2 playground. We do have to wait until the funds have been presented to the P&C before works can begin on this, however, we are excited to progress with this as soon as we are able.

School Communication Channels

To ensure you receive all relevant school information please check that you have alerts turned on for Erina Heights Public School in your App settings. Permission notes that require payment are emailed and a hard copy sent home with students. The school newsletter is updated on our school website each fortnight. Class Dojo is used for individual class purposes only. The school Facebook page is used to celebrate students and school events.

School Improvements

We feel very fortunate to have undergone many school improvements that have had a significant impact on students sense of belonging and pride in their school. These improvements have included the new backfield, upgrades to classrooms and furniture, improved and increased access to technology. new sports equipment, maths resources in every classroom, new readers for all K-2 classrooms, rich quality texts to support and inspire learning and a love of reading. We are also very fortunate to have Lisa Lewis as our Deputy Principal. Lisa leads high quality, targeted professional learning for staff each week as well as instructional leadership within the classroom. This rich focus on curriculum and teaching and learning is having a the school big impact across on teachers and students.

Uniform upgrade

We look forward to introducing our new uniform next year and it is great to see the excitement amongst students. There is a 3year introduction period for the new school uniform, so there is no pressure on families to purchase the new uniform anytime soon. Discussions and community consultation about a new uniform were initiated prior to my appointment as Principal to Erina Heights. A committee was formed in 2019 with parents, staff and executive members. Feedback was sought from students, staff and parents throughout the whole process and this feedback was used to inform the design and colours of the uniform. 


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CLASS UPDATE - S3R

Walking and Cycling Safely

Walking and cycling are great ways to get exercise but it's important we keep ourselves and others as safe as possible. Here are some tips to help keep you safe.

WALKING

- Take your time and plan your walk you're more likely to slip or trip if you're rushed.
- Wear safe shoes with slip resistant soles.
- Wear bright colours to increase your visibility, especially at dawn or dusk.
- · Ensure you wear your hearing aid or glasses.
- · Use the footpaths and shared pathways when available.
- Be aware of children, joggers, cyclists and animals.
 When you're on a chared pathway, keep to the left to
- When you're on a shared pathway, keep to the left to allow room for cyclists to pass.
- Listen out for nearby cyclists who are encouraged to ring their bell or horn to warn pedestrians that they're about to pass.
- If you stop to talk with someone, if possible move off the shared pathway or footpath, or to the far left of the path.
- When crossing the road, take the safest, shortest and most direct route.
- Use pedestrian crossings or traffic lights. If there
 aren't any, look for the safest place to cross.
- Wait for vehicles to stop completely before stepping off a kerb.
- Check for turning vehicles and cyclists at intersections before crossing.
- Never assume a driver can see you their vision may be affected by poor light, sunlight or parked cars.
- If you're a bit unsteady, use handrails on stairs or ramps.

WALKING WITH A DOG

Keep dogs on short leads and under control at all times.

CYCLING

By law, you must wear an Australian and New Zealand approved helmet. Make sure the straps on your helmet are not twisted and it fits securely around your ears and under your chin. Wear brightly coloured clothing so you're easily seen by others.

Central Coast

- Your bike must have a working brake, bell or horn and a rear reflector. If used at night, it must also have a front white light and a rear red light.
- Check your bike every ride: (A) Air in tyres (B) Brakes are working (C) Chain intact.
- Travel at a speed that is safe for you and the pedestrians you encounter.
- Always be in control of your bike and ride in a predictable manner so that others do not have to react suddenly to your movements.
- When riding on shared pathways, keep to the left. If you're planning to pass someone, slow down and use your bell or horn to let them know you're close by and pass carefully on their right side.
- Allow pedestrians one metre of space on shared paths when passing, where possible.
- Children should be closely supervised and should not ride near busy roads.
- Obey all road rules, including traffic lights, 'Stop' and 'Give Way' signs.
- Use hand signals when changing lanes or turning left or right.
- Stay a 'car door width' away from parked vehicles.
- Riding on footpaths is not permitted. Exceptions to this rule are children under 16 years and supervising adult(s), who may ride on the footpath unless signs state otherwise. Children 16 years and older may also ride on the footpath when with an adult accompanying a child/children who are under 16 years.
