What's happening in S3R

The 2020 Premier's Reading Challenge began on Monday 2 March. Students who have participated in previous years can start accessing their account from this date. The Challenge closes on August 28. New students to the program need to log in using their school username and password. Your Co-ordinator Mrs Kent is available on Monday and Tuesday's at school. Please familiarise yourself with the rules for the challenge and have fun reading!

Premier's Reading Challenge

Tips for parents and carers for participating in the Challenge

- D Find out the name(s) of your school's Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) coordinator(s) and how they plan to administer the Challenge.
- D Familiarise yourself with the new <u>PRC student website</u>. There is a video on the <u>PRC Support site that you can watch that demonstrates how login, search for books and add them to a Student Reading Record (SRR).</u>
- D Visit the <u>Premier's Reading Challenge Support website</u>. It allows you to search for information about the PRC and how to use the PRC website and also how to <u>contact the PRC team</u>.
- D Set reminders for Challenge opening and closing dates in your and your child's calendar.
- D Find out your child's logon details. For public schools, students' logon will be the same one they use to access computers and the internet at school. Non-government students will need to contact the PRC Coordinator at their school if they cannot remember their login details.
- D Assist your child to borrow books from the school or local library. Listen to your child read and talk about the story/ characters/ information. Read to or with your child if she/he is participating in the K-2 Challenge.
- D Help your child to add books to her/his Student Reading Record regularly.
- D Follow The Arts Unit on Facebook and the NSW PRC on Instagram to keep up to date about information about the Challenge throughout the year. We regularly run contests and Author events your child may be interested in taking part in.
- D Contact your child's PRC coordinator if:
 - Your child has any difficulty using her/his logon details to access the PRC website.
 - You are concerned that your child's name is spelt incorrectly in the PRC website.
 - If you need to check your child's Challenge history, please contact your child's PRC coordinator.
- D Your child's online Student Reading Record must have the required number of books recorded to complete the Challenge by **the <u>student closing date</u>**. School PRC coordinators have an extra two weeks to validate the SRR. **Only students with a validated SRR are eligible for a certificate**.
- D In the final weeks of the Challenge, log on regularly to the website to check the status of your child's SRR. Contact your child's PRC coordinator if you are concerned your child's SRR has not been validated.

Premiers Reading Challenge

Rules

PLEASE NOTE: There have been updates to Challenge Rules 2, 5, 7 and 14 effective for the 2020 Challenge onwards. Please make sure you have familiarised yourself with these rule changes.

- 1. The Challenge opens on 2 March 2020. You must complete your online Student Reading Record by 28 August 2020 (11:59 pm) to complete the Challenge.
- 2. You must read a certain number of books to complete the Challenge:

Challenge	Number of books you	Minimum number of	Maximum number of	PRC booklists you can

K-2	30	25	5	K-2; 3-4; 5-6
3-4	20	15	5	3-4; 5-6; 7-9
5-6	20	15	5	5-6; 7-9

- 3. Books you read after the Challenge closes can count towards the next year's Challenge.
- 4a. K-2 Challenge: you can read the books on your own, read them with someone, or someone can read them to you.
- 4b. 3-4, 5-6 and 7-9 Challenges: you must read the books on your own, but someone can help you choose them.
- 5. In an approved series on the PRC booklist, you can read any three books as PRC books. You can read up to five other books from the same series as Personal Choice books.
- 6a. K-2 Challenge: you can read books or have them read to you in your home language.
- 6b. 3-4, 5-6 and 7-9 Challenges: you must read all PRC books in English. You may read Personal Choice books in your home language.
- 7a. K-2 students only- If you can read simple chapter books on your own, you can attempt the 3-4 Challenge. You need to get your Student Reading Record changed to Challenge level 3-4. See your PRC coordinator for help with this.
- 7b. 3-4, 5-6 and 7-9 students only: students with special needs who would experience difficulty completing the challenge at their grade-appropriate level can take part in the 3-9 Challenge. Students on the 3-9 Challenge level will complete the challenge by reading 20 books from any challenge level (including K-2) with whatever levels of support are appropriate to their needs. PRC coordinators should submit requests for changes to the 3-9 challenge by 31 July.
- 8. 3-4, 5-6, 7-9 students only- If your teacher thinks you need extra help, you can listen to unabridged audio versions of the books as long as you read along.
- 9. If you complete your online Student Reading Record by 28 August 2020, and it is validated by your school by 11 September (11:59 pm), you will be eligible for a PRC certificate in Term 4.



10. The certificates you can receive for completing the Challenge are:

Sixth Year	Challenge completion certificate	
Seventh Year	Platinum Certificate	

- 11. You can only receive one certificate each year.
- 12. Gold and Platinum certificates will be sent to your school in Term 4 with students' names printed. Your school is responsible for downloading and printing your Challenge Completion Certificate from the PRC website.
- 13. Your school needs to make sure your parent or carer knows that by entering the Challenge, you may receive a PRC certificate with your name and school printed. The Premier's Reading Challenge no longer lists student names on an Honour Roll, however there may be opportunities for students to be recognised through media publications or through the school's own newsletters and communications. No student names and/or details will be published publicly without prior consent from parents/ carers.
- 14a. If you attend a NSW school and your school does not have a PRC coordinator and does not wish to participate in the Challenge, you can take part as an independent student. Your Challenge participation will be managed by the PRC team. You must inform the PRC team of your completion of the challenge by 28 August so that your record can be validated.
- 14b. If you are home schooled, you can participate in the PRC once registered with the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) or granted an exemption from registration. You must register with the PRC before 31 July.




Statements of Account - Online Payment Guide

Erina Heights Public School will be sending student statements of account & payment reminders directly to parents/caregivers via email using a system called School Bytes. These statements include a link to make secure payment online through the Westpac Parent Online Payment (POP) system (Visa & Mastercard credit/debit cards accepted).

To make an online payment for your child(ren)'s school contributions, please follow the steps below:


 You will receive an email from the school's email address (<u>erinahts-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au</u>) with the subject 'Student Statement of Account' or 'Payment Reminder'.



2. To make an online credit card payment, click the secure payment button in the email.



Once this button is clicked, you will be taken to a webpage on www.parentpayments.com.au. On this page, you will see a list of all currently outstanding items for your child. By default, all items are selected/ticked for payment.

School Bytes

If you wish to change the amount you would like to pay for an item, enter the desired amount in the number field under the 'Balance Owing' column.

To not pay for a certain item, untick the checkbox in the left-hand column of the table next to the item you wish to remove.




Once you have selected what items you wish to pay, enter your name, phone number and email address under 'Payer Details'. This allows the school to identify which parent/caregiver is making the payment.

Now, press the 'Next' button to be redirected to a secure Westpac site to finalise your online payment.



Once redirected to Westpac, you will see the following screen. Enter your credit card details into the appropriate text fields on this screen. Once completed, press the 'Proceed to Confirmation' button.


