Principal Update



Welcome back to Term 4

We look forward to other activities this term that include excursions, Athletics Carnival, Kindergarten Orientation and Year 6 to 7 Transition.

If your child is unwell

If your child is unwell with flu like symptoms it is still a requirement that you have them COVID tested and that the negative result is sent through to the school prior to their return. Any student who presents with flu like symptoms at school will be sent to the office and parents will be contacted to collect them as soon as possible.

Munch and Crunch fruit/vegetable break

Each day students across K-6 are offered a fruit break during the morning session of learning. Teachers take a 10minute break where they might go outside for some movement or sit and listen to a book or student news. During this time students can enjoy some fruit or vegetables; all other foods should be saved for recess and lunch breaks.

Class structures for 2021

Morning play on the backfield
