

#### **COVID-19 Update**

Just a reminder of information that has been sent previously in regards to your child being unwell.

- Parents/carers are reminded that students must not come to school if they are unwell even with very mild symptoms.
- Teachers should be vigilant in recognising if any students are exhibiting flu like symptoms during teaching and learning activities.
- Where identified, teachers must refer students to the sick bay where they can be isolated and the school must arrange for the parent or carer to take them home.
- If a student has been absent due to flu like illness or develops flu like symptoms while at school (even if mild), they are not to return to school until they have a negative COVID-19 test and are symptom free. The negative COVID-19 test result must be sighted and received by the school before his or her return to school.





### Stage 1 Science Day


Our experiment tested the density of oil, food colouring, and water. First, we wrote up our scientific method, which included our different hypothesises and our step by step procedure. Then we got stuck in! The first step was adding the food colouring to the oil and the result took lots of us by surprise when the colouring turned into little bubbles. We poured the mixture into the water and observed the less dense oil rise to the top. As the denser food colouring sunk to the bottom it created some beautiful swirls.

Mrs Thaler's science activity was using block coding to design a simple arcade game. Stage 1 students used Microsoft MakeCode Arcade tutorials to create a game where the 'sprite #1' player 1 chased and caught 'sprite #2' player 2, which we made some sort of food. Students needed to set a time limit and assign points for every time sprite #1 caught sprite #2. Once students complete the tutorial, they can name their game and are given a link to send their game to friends and family to test out and play their game. I was really impressed with their creativity and enthusiasm.

### Stage 1 Science Day

Last Thursday Stage 1 enjoyed a "SCIENCE DAY" full of exciting and challenging science activities. The students rotated through 4 activities:

- 1. A scientific "worm" study
- 2. A science experiment investigating mass and weight
- 3. A paper plane STEM challenge
- 4. A coding activity using the lpads and computers.

The scientific "worm" study involved the students observing real life worms from my worm farm. They had to observe the colours of the worms, the shapes of the worms, describe how the worm's skin feels, investigate if there is a difference between the top side and bottom side of a worm, discover which was the front end and back end of a worm, describe how a worm moves, and illustrate their worms.

Did you know: an earthworm has 5 hearts! Did you know: there are 4,400 species of worms, and 2,700 different kinds of earthworms!

The students had so much fun being scientists for the day!
