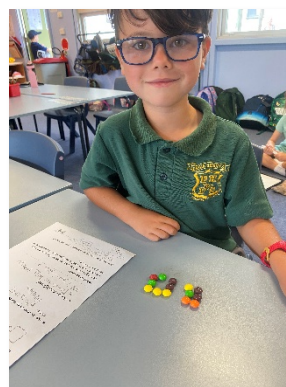

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PRINCIPAL REPORT

Regional Renewal Program

We were excited to receive confirmation last week that we have been successful in Round 2 offerings of the Regional Renewal Program. An administration building upgrade has been approved as part of this state-wide program. At this point there has been no timeframe provided as to when works will start or finish, but this will be a wonderful improvement to our school that will benefit students, staff and our community.

Crossing Supervisor

As part of the review of current traffic issues, we applied and were successful in gaining a Crossing Supervisor position for the pedestrian crossing on Serpentine Road. This will ensure the safety of all students who cross the road each morning and afternoon.

This will also give parents the option of parking further along Serpentine Road for afternoon pick up, knowing that children will be able to cross the road safely.

K-2 playground – Adam Crouch grant

Last year our P&C were successful in gaining a \$30,000 Community Building Partnership grant. Adam Crouch came in last week to present us with a token cheque to recognise this contribution to our school. This money will be used towards a K-2 playground upgrade that is planned for the K-2 area of the school. Part of this installation will include a playground that was donated to the school from Central Coast Grammar.

We are currently waiting on Schools Infrastructure to complete a scope of works so that this project can go out to tender.

Aboriginal Leaders

This week our three Aboriginal student leaders were very excited to be presented with their student leader badges. They have taken on a new role within our student leadership team.

Acknowledgement to Country

As part of a unit of work about Aboriginal culture and history, each Stage 3 class has written their own Acknowledgement of Country. A few weeks ago, I shared that Ms Bailey and 5B had presented their class acknowledgement to the executive staff from the School Leadership Institute. The team were so impressed with the authenticity of 5B's Acknowledgement that they reached out and asked if they would do the Acknowledgement for the Deputy Principal Induction Conference that is attended by over 300 Deputy Principals from across NSW. As the conference is held remotely, we have had 5B's acknowledgement filmed and this will be shared as the official Acknowledgement to open this event.

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SWIMMING CARNIVAL NEWS

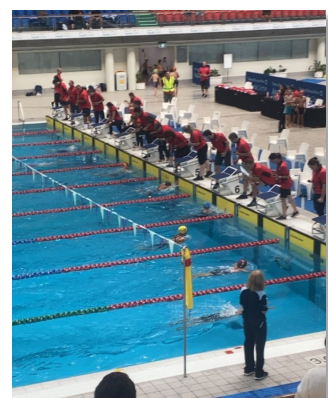
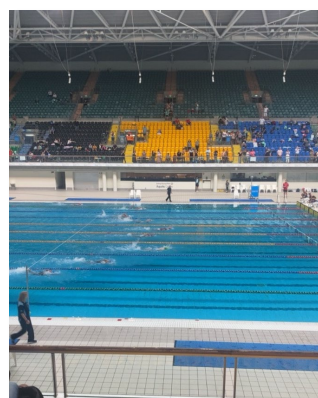

1B

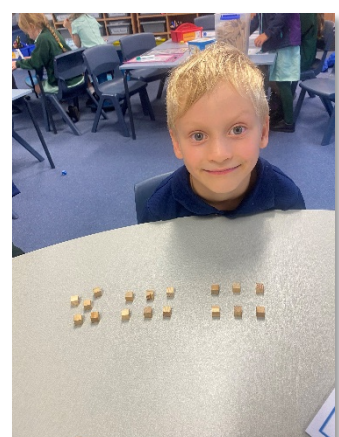
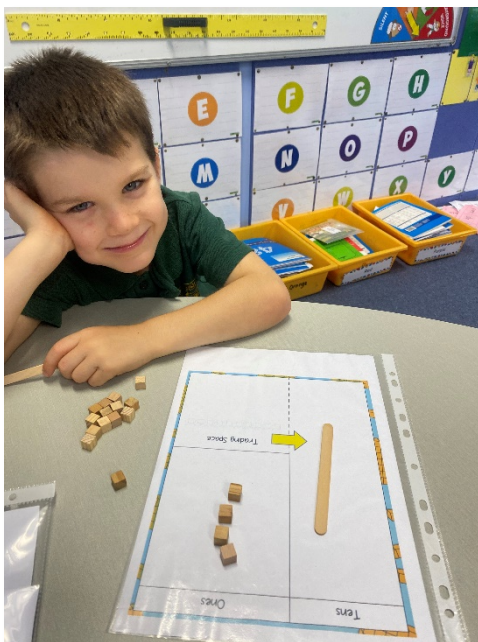
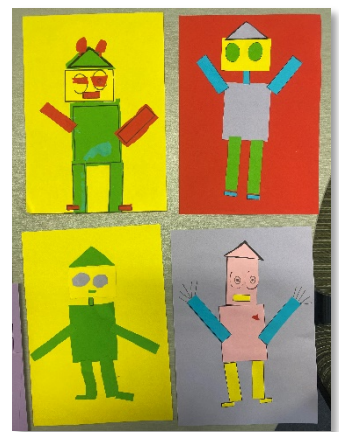
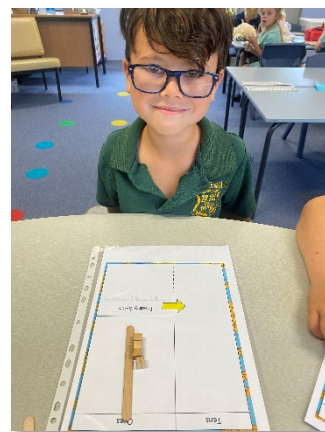
1B students have settled in class. We have been reading *'Where the Wild Things Are'* and discussing various parts of the text. We have been looking at the pictures to see how they change and how we can gain further meaning from them. We have also been studying adjectives and how they add detail to our writing.

Last week in Maths, we studied two-dimensional shapes and have undertaken an investigation on which shapes are most popular around Erina Heights. We have discovered the difference between squares and rectangles using skittles and using our shapes to build a robot.

This week we have been learning about addition and subtraction. We have shared our new skills to parent helpers.

In our 'Flip Your Lid' Personal Development unit, we have been looking at developing strategies to stop us from 'flipping our lids'. We also brainstormed ideas about what we can do on the occasions that we do lose our tempers and 'flip our lid'. We made little creatures and are using these strategies to keep them safe.

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CLASSROOM NEWS

4K

4K have been exploring texts about courage this term. We explored the courage shown by Malala Yousafai through the text, '*Malala's Magic Pencil*'. Students created their own magic pencil and demonstrated their passion towards education for all children around the world. In Maths, we explored length and measured the perimeter of many things in our classroom and around the school.

In 4K we are focused on doing our personal best, which was evident in our physical education lesson. We applied our knowledge of length to measure the distance between the lines on our basketball court. This allowed us to accurately complete a beep fitness test. 4K students were determined to do their personal best in the beep fitness test, with some students achieving a score higher than 10. Students are eager to have another go and improve on this result.

4K have had some fun with science this week, looking at chemistry and how chemicals move from higher concentrations to lower concentrations, using skittles, water and a sugar cube. Students hypothesised, performed an experiment and made conclusions and brainstormed other places we might see this reaction occur, such as mixing cordial. We look forward to more fun science experiments!

PREMIER'S READING Challenge

Premier's Reading Challenge

The 2021 Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) opened on the 1st March and runs until the 20th August, 2021. This challenge is free for students to participate in and promotes a love of reading. Your child's Department of Education (DoE) username and password are used to logon to the PRC portal. These are the same details a student would use to access the student portal and computer network at school. If you're unsure of these details, please contact your child's classroom teacher.

Kindergarten and Stage 1 students are reading some of their 30 Premier's Reading Challenge books as part of their Library lessons. These books will be recorded on the PRC site by Mrs Schofield, however, they are also encouraged to participate in this great scheme at home. Students in Stage 2 and 3 are required to read 20 books (15 from the PRC book list and 5 free choices). Successful students will receive a certificate signed by the Premier of NSW.

Premier's Reading Challenge

Tips for parents and carers for participating in the Challenge

- D Find out the name(s) of your school's Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) coordinator(s) and how they plan to administer the Challenge.
- D Familiarise yourself with the new [PRC student website](#). There is a video on the [PRC Support site that you can watch that demonstrates how login, search for books and add them to a Student Reading Record \(SRR\)](#).
- D Visit the [Premier's Reading Challenge Support website](#). It allows you to search for information about the PRC and how to use the PRC website and also how to [contact the PRC team](#).
- D Set reminders for Challenge [opening and closing dates](#) in your and your child's calendar.
- D Find out your [child's logon details](#). For public schools, students' logon will be the same one they use to access computers and the internet at school. Non-government students will need to contact the PRC Coordinator at their school if they cannot remember their login details.
- D Assist your child to borrow books from the school or local library. Listen to your child read and talk about the story/ characters/ information. Read to or with your child if she/he is participating in the K-2 Challenge.
- D Help your child to add books to her/his Student Reading Record **regularly**.
- D Follow The Arts Unit on Facebook and the NSW PRC on Instagram to keep up to date about information about the Challenge throughout the year. We regularly run contests and Author events your child may be interested in taking part in.
- D Contact your child's **PRC coordinator** if:
 - Your child has any difficulty using her/his logon details to access the PRC website.
 - You are concerned that your child's name is spelt incorrectly in the PRC website.
 - If you need to check your child's Challenge history, please contact your child's PRC coordinator.
- D Your child's online Student Reading Record must have the required number of books recorded to complete the Challenge by **the [student closing date](#)**. School PRC coordinators have an extra two weeks to validate the SRR. **Only students with a validated SRR are eligible for a certificate.**
- D **In the final weeks of the Challenge, log on regularly to the website to check the status of your child's SRR.** Contact your child's PRC coordinator if you are concerned your child's SRR has not been validated.

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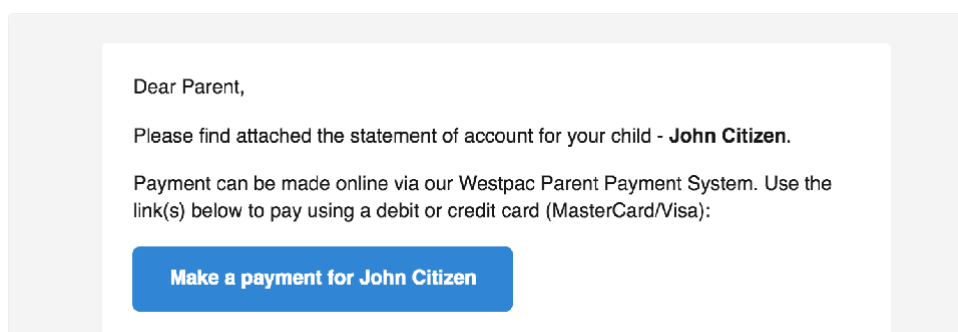

Statements of Account – Online Payment Guide

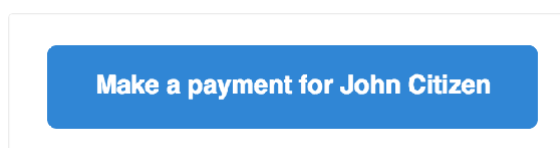
Erina Heights Public School will be sending student statements of account & payment reminders directly to parents/caregivers via email using a system called School Bytes. These statements include a link to make secure payment online through the Westpac Parent Online Payment (POP) system (Visa & Mastercard credit/debit cards accepted).

To make an online payment for your child(ren)'s school contributions, please follow the steps below:

1. You will receive an email from the school's email address (erinahts-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au) with the subject 'Student Statement of Account' or 'Payment Reminder'.



2. To make an online credit card payment, click the secure payment button in the email.



3. Once this button is clicked, you will be taken to a webpage on www.parentpayments.com.au.

On this page, you will see a list of all currently outstanding items for your child. By default, all items are selected/ticked for payment.

4. If you wish to change the amount you would like to pay for an item, enter the desired amount in the number field under the 'Balance Owning' column.

To not pay for a certain item, untick the checkbox in the left-hand column of the table next to the item you wish to remove.

5. Once you have selected what items you wish to pay, enter your name, phone number and email address under 'Payer Details'. This allows the school to identify which parent/caregiver is making the payment.

Now, press the 'Next' button to be redirected to a secure Westpac site to finalise your online payment.

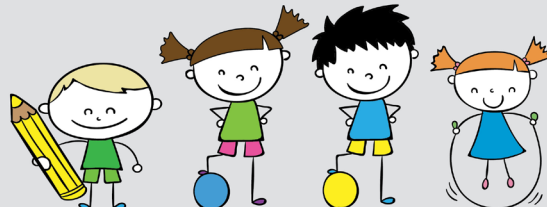

Bonsai Trees with Vanja Tuesday 6 April 10—12pm

Students will create mini bonsai trees from twisted wire adorned with beads. The trees will be inspired by the ancient black pines in the Edogawa Commemorative Garden.

Russian Dolls with Vanja Tuesday 6 April 1—3pm

Students will paint a series of 5 Russian dolls and learn about the history and culture of this Russian tradition.

Kandinsky's Tree with Natalie Wednesday 7 April 10—12pm

A fun filled workshop producing work inspired by Kandinsky. Students will use bright colours to create a sculptural work based on Kandinsky's abstract tree.

Nolan's Kelly with Natalie Wednesday 7 April 1—3pm
