#### Meeting Premier of NSW, Gladys Berejiklian

It was a personal highlight to meet and enjoy afternoon tea with the Premier of NSW, Gladys Berejiklian during the holiday period. After visiting the Central Coast to officially open a palliative care unit at Gosford Hospital and the Terrigal Boardwalk. I was very proud to stand beside Mrs Lewis and our two student leaders Isla and Harvey, to represent the Erina Heights community at the service. Isla and Harvey laid a wreath to pay respect on behalf of our school in acknowledging and honouring the service and sacrifices of our defence personnel. #### **Attendance**

One of our mandatory school targets is to improve student attendance. We recognise and understand that it is important for students to stay at home and rest when they are unwell, however, our focus is on regular attendance at school.

If a student averages 5 days off per term throughout their entire schooling K-12, this equates to missing 10% of their schooling and a total of 260 days, which is more than 1 year of learning.

Regular attendance at school is essential in ensuring that all students maximise their potential.

In line with the School Attendance Policy, it is important that all student absences are explained. Please contact the office or the class teacher as soon as possible following an absence so that the absence can be justified. Any absence that is not explained within 7 days, remains unexplained on your child's record and this cannot be rectified or adjusted.

#### **Cross Country**

Growing up Digital - some educational research

A new research report by the Gonski Institute for Education reveals digital media and technologies as a great distraction in Australian family life.

More than 9 out of 10 parents think digital devices are a adverse distraction in their own lives, and 83% think their children are also distracted negatively by digital gadgets.

While parents find digital technologies useful in staying connected with their children and keeping them safe, three-quarters of parents think it is difficult to control their child's digital habits. As many as 65% of parents also admit that negotiating the use of digital media and technologies at home causes conflicts with their children.

About a third of families allow their children to use their digital devices after bedtime every single day. Furthermore, three of five children who struggle in school regularly sleep with their digital gadgets.

"Although our study is not able to prove that night-time use of smartphone or computer causes difficulties to keep up good learning at school, parents should help their children to fall asleep without technology", Prof. Sahlberg says.

According to earlier findings, two-thirds of Australian teachers observed more children arriving at school tired and often not ready to learn.



2T have had a fantastic start to 2021. We would love to share some photos with you about various artworks and activities we have done over the last term.






Maths group - In Mathematics this week 2T are learning about multiplication and division. Creating arrays and diagrams that link to multiplication facts.
