




Canberra Excursion




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Canteen Helpers

From 2022, we will be asking parents to provide dictionaries for their children in Years 3 to 6. For those who are happy to purchase one sooner, the school will be placing a bulk order, and these will be available to buy through the school <u>from the beginning of Term 3, 2021</u>. Alternatively, parents are free to source their own copy.

For practicality, it is important that <u>every student has the same</u> <u>dictionary</u> so teachers can teach dictionary skills effectively. The selected dictionary is the *Macmillan Australian Student Dictionary* **2**nd *Edition* (see left) which retails for approximately \$24.00.

Even in this electronic age, where there are many dictionary resources available online, print dictionaries still play a very important part in primary school classrooms. The ability to look up a word, phrase, concept, or idea using alphabetical order and then build upon what you've found is a developmental milestone that our children still need to learn and reach.



Premier's Reading Challenge

The 2021 Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) opened on the 1st March and runs until the 20th August, 2021. This challenge is free for students to participate in and promotes a love of reading. Your child's Department of Education (DoE) username and password are used to logon to the PRC portal. These are the same details a student would use to access the student portal and computer network at school. If you're unsure of these details, please contact your child's classroom teacher.

Kindergarten and Stage 1 students are reading some of their 30 Premier's Reading Challenge books as part of their Library lessons. These books will be recorded on the PRC site by Mrs Schofield, however, they are also encouraged to participate in this great scheme at home. Students in Stage 2 and 3 are required to read 20 books (15 from the PRC book list and 5 free choices). Successful students will receive a certificate signed by the Premier of NSW.



Cultural events happening this term


<u>Reconciliation Week</u> is May 27th - 3rd June. During this Week students will begin their Reconciliation Challenge.

Reconciliation Challenge The School's Reconciliation Challenge is one way for students to learn about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australia and contribute positively to Australian society, while meeting the objectives of the K-6 and 7-10 syllabus. Every year, we ask students to create artworks and stories inspired by a theme, and to reflect on what reconciliation means to them. This year in 2021 we celebrate 12 years of the Schools Reconciliation Challenge and our theme is *Under One Sky: Yesterday, Today and Forever.*

Who can enter? Years 3-10 (or of equivalent age), Indigenous and non-Indigenous, of all abilities, can enter. Young people may participate through their school or independently. It's free to take part.

Students will be completing their artworks during class time and this will be due by the end of Term 2.

Students in K-2 will be participating in the event, however their artworks will not be submitted in the competition.



NAIDOC Week Heal Country

NAIDOC week occurs from July 4-11. This is during the school holidays therefore Erina Heights Public School will be celebrating during Week 10 of Term 2. The theme this year is Heal Country and so students will be participating in various cultural activities throughout the week based on this theme.






Each and every student has made me realise how much I have missed having a class of my own. I look forward to lots of fun and laughs on our learning journey together.

KG





Parliament and Civics Education Rebate (PACER)

Students from our school will soon be undertaking an educational tour of the national capital. Students will be given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$30.00 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion.
