



Next, we were off to Bulgandry Aboriginal site in Kariong. We listened to the meanings and connections of the rock carvings with Uncle Gavi.

It was a fantastic day and a great way to finish off our history unit from Term 3. Thank you to Shannon Harvey, Kylie Wells and Rebecca Cowan who volunteered on the day, you were all amazing.
