Transition into new classes for 2023

Whilst very much focused on the academic work and range of co-curricular programs that are set down for the remainder of 2022, our staff are also planning carefully for the 2023 school year. One of the key areas that we begin to consider at this time of year are the strategies that we put into place to enable our students to have a smooth transition from their class this year to the class that they will be in for 2023.

Heading into 2023 our enrolment numbers are right on the cusp of 10 or 11 classes. 

Motivated Learner

Be an Active Communicator

This fortnight, our Motivated Learner focus is being an active communicator. It's important to think before you speak and say what you mean as accurately and as honestly as you can. You model this every day in your conversations.

In class this means they will join in discussions and listen attentively. These are important skills as they help your child clarify their understanding and help them focus on the lesson that is being taught. A motivated learner is someone who consistently asks questions about their learning and adds other ideas to what has already been said.

You can encourage your child with this skill by having rich conversations with them at home. Allow them to ask questions, give you their own point of view about the topic and to justify their own opinions with reasons.

Strategies to try:

1: Say it Once

Repeating ourselves will produce lazy listening in our children. If kids are accustomed to hearing instructions twice, three times, and even four times, listening the first time around becomes unnecessary.

2: Pay Attention, Pause, Paraphrase

Children need structured opportunities to restrain themselves from speaking to keep their attention on listening, especially when talking in groups.

3: Creating Questions

If your children are listening to a speech, watching a documentary clip, or hearing a story read aloud, break it up by stopping a few times and having students write a question or two about what they just heard.

4: Motivating Words

Good listeners are both rare and valued. It's important to share this with your children, and to also share the fact that people who really listen -- make eye contact, show interest, and restrain from cutting others off in a conversation -- are easy to like and respect.

5: Play listening games when you travelling in the car e.g. I Spy
