A Great Start at Erina Heights Public School

In my current role I will be working closely with staff to provide rich learning experiences in literacy and numeracy for all our students. Together, we aim to develop student dispositions and thinking and make our school a place where thinking is valued, visible and actively promoted as part of everyday learning.





ANZAC Day Assembly

On Friday 8 April, Erina Heights Public School held their ANZAC Day assembly. We were honoured to have two very special guests attend and address our school - Mr Luke Hill and Mr David Ferry. Mr Hill spoke of his personal experiences and the history of ANZAC Day, and Mr Ferry spoke of the history of Erina Heights Public School and the link between the statue of the soldiers at the Terrigal War Memorial and the school.

School History

In 1914, Mr Walter Herbert Weiss was the Principal of Erina Heights Public School. One of his sons, Frederick Alfred Weiss - known as Private Frederic Alfred Weiss was in the 53rd Battalion and was killed in action in the First World War on 19 July 1916 at Fromelles. He is commemorated on the Erina/Terrigal War Memorial.

A second son of Mr and Mrs Weiss was Erle Victor Weiss. He was known as Bombardier Erle Victor Weiss and was killed in action in the First World War on 9 August 1918. He too is commemorated on the Erina/Terrigal War Memorial. Erle and Frederick Weiss are on the Erina Heights Public School Honour Roll.

A third son of Mr and Mrs Weiss — Private Harry Blanch Weiss of the 2/30 Battalion of Singleton NSW was taken prisoner of war of the Japanese and died of illness whilst in captivity in Thailand on 30 September 1943.

All classes made a wreath and placed the wreath on the stage during the assembly. The students are to be commended for their respectful behaviour throughout the assembly.

Thank you to Mr Hill and Mr Ferry for joining us and addressing our ANZAC Day assembly.
