
Concert Date

Over the past two weeks students in Year 3 & 5 have completed their NAPLAN assessments in Writing, Reading, Language & Conventions and Numeracy. NAPLAN results will allow parents, carers, and teachers to see how students are progressing in literacy and numeracy – individually, as part of our school community, and against national standards.

Whilst we understand that NAPLAN tests are only one aspect our assessment process, the results will provide teachers with valuable information about what teaching practices are working and any areas to be prioritised to improve student outcomes.

On behalf of the Year 3 & Year 5 teachers I would like to congratulate all the children on how they conducted themselves throughout the testing period. Every child did their personal best had a wonderful 'have a go attitude' that epitomised our school values.

Here is a reminder of some of the rules:

1. You must complete your online Student Reading Record by 19 August 2022 (11:59 pm) to complete the Challenge.

2. You must read a certain number of books to complete the Challenge. Please refer to the <u>Booklists page</u> for more information. (I have highlighted the choices available for us.)

4a. K-2 and 3-9 challenges: you can read books on your own, read them with someone else, or someone can read them to you.

4b. 3-4, 5-6 and 7-9 challenges: you must read books on your own, but someone can help you choose them.


Congratulations Teal W, Archie W, Jack G, Madeiline A and Ari B for completing their challenge in such a short time! Gabby in Kindy is close behind!


