

New School Discipline Procedures

We have recently reviewed our school Discipline Procedures to support positive behaviour among all students. These new processes will support individual students who are demonstrating complex or challenging behaviours and will provide an opportunity for students to reflect on their behaviour, create a plan to support the child and then have a monitoring card for follow up. Monitoring behaviour and giving students an opportunity to succeed. The Department is pushing out an update to student behaviour policy and procedures and all schools will be required to create a School Behaviour Support and Management Plan. These new procedures will form part of this management plan.

We are excited to welcome all our 2023 Kindergarten students in Weeks 2-6 next term as they begin our official Kindergarten Orientation Program.




Know someone who is enrolling or leaving 2023



Why attendance matters

When your child misses school they miss important opportunities to...

How to support your child?

Help your child understand that school is their very first job!

- Make great school attendance a priority for your child.
- Talk to your child about the importance of daily attendance in every class and how it helps his/her learning.

When students miss so much school, they potentially develop gaps in their learning. If your child comes to school regularly and on time, they are more likely to achieve better results and avoid disrupting the learning of others.

Help your child develop good habits

- Help your child practice good daily habits like:
- finishing homework and placing it in his/her backpack
- laying out clothes and the backpack in the evening
- having a regular bedtime for a good night's sleep
- •leaving early enough in the morning to get to school on time.
- •turn off electronic devices one hour before bedtime.
- •Help your child build responsibility skills by reminding them to make up any missed schoolwork after an absence.

When your child is sick

•Only let your child stay home if he/she is truly sick. Sometimes complaints of a headache or stomach-ache might be a sign of anxiety and not a reason to stay home. Contact the **teacher** for support if you think this might be happening.

Appointments and vacations

- Make every effort to schedule doctor, dentist, and other appointments after school hours.
- •If your child must be out of school for an appointment, get him/her back to school for at least part of the school day.
- •Plan vacations when school is not in session.

Attendance records

- •Contact the school every time your child will be absent.
- •Keep your contact information up-to-date with the school (phone numbers, address, parent work location, email address, etc.).
