We have recently seen a decline in the school uniform being worn with students wearing different jumpers, tights or leggings and socks with large logos and in a range of colours.








Premier's Spelling Bee Regional Final

MOTIVATED LEARNER

Year 6 is helping us to be motivated learners. For the last 2 weeks our focus has been:

Having a Positive Attitude to Learning

Here are some ways you can help your child develop this skill after a day at school.

Discuss 3 positive things about your child's learning each day.

Often children get stuck on what went wrong during their day, and this can overshadow the positive things. Instead of asking your child 'How was your day?' Ask them 'What are 3 positive/fun things that happened today?' What did your learning look like today? Their answers may be just that they got to play handball, or did maths, but this will slowly build their confidence towards school and their learning.

Help your child set achievable goals

Setting goals gives children something to work towards. When children reach their goal, their self-belief increases, and it shows them what hard work and persistence can achieve. Setting goals also allows children to take risks they would otherwise not feel comfortable with.

1. Let them know that it is okay to express their feelings.

One of the most important ways to help your children be positive in life is by letting them acknowledge their emotions. Be it sadness, happiness, fear, shame, worry, or any other emotion, let them know that we all experience these emotions. If your child is unhappy or angry, encourage them to talk about their feelings. Encourage them to look for solutions instead of worrying about the problem. This way they will begin to understand that every problem has a solution.

2. Be a role model.

Children learn a great deal from their parents. If you remain positive in life, your kids will develop the same attitude. You may not be aware, but your children observe your every action, feelings, and emotions. Slowly and gradually, they start following whatever you think or believe. Show them that remaining positive in the face of adversity and everything that follows is possible and can be good. This will help them develop a positive attitude.

3. Encourage and motivate your kids.

Encourage them to look at the positive things in life. Celebrate their successes and encourage them to share and own the mistakes. A favourite phrase we use at school is 'we learn best when we learn from our mistakes.'

4. Encourage positivity through stories and games.


